The comparison confirms the WSCC race weekends are the least expensive and provide the highest number of track sessions.

When Hot Laps/TestNTune are included then the WSCC race weekends also provide the highest amount of track time. The Hot Laps/TestNTune are broken into separate run groups and it is not feasible for a driver to change cars and drive in every run group but a couple hours of total track time are realistic out of the total six hours of Hot Laps/TestNTune sessions.

Both the Canadian venues provide large discounts to drivers that are racing at their non-home track. This suggests that the Canadian venues are relatively remote and need to provide "tow funds" to encourage non-home track racers to travel that distance.

Please note that some race weekends allow a single car to be entered into more than one class for additional fees that would increase the amount of track time. However, trying to include this into the comparison was difficult as there are too many combinations of classes to make a meaningful comparison.

Also, it was difficult to make direct comparisons between the many different classes in the different sanctioning bodies (WCMA, SCCA, VSCDA) and some specific classes have additional fees. This comparison was done using the vintage class during race weekends that included vintage races.

The exchange rate used was \$1.00USD = \$1.33CDN and the actual fees will vary as the exchange rate fluctuates.

21 Years of Vintage Racing in Gimli

August 16th, 2019 will mark the 21st anniversary of the Classic Motor Works Vintage weekend, celebrating the 60th anniversary of the classic Austin Mini.

We thought it's probably timely to review how we got here starting with our track. In 1972 the Winnipeg Sports Car Club (WSCC) raced at Gimli in front of the hangers which led to the building of Gimli Motorsport Park (GMP) in 1973. Today GMP is the longest continuous operated track in Western Canada.

Over the years we have hosted Canada's premier road racing series such as the Club Beer National Endurance 1974 to 1976, Molyslip Endurance 1977 to 1982 and the Canadian National Run Offs 1974, 1981 and 1982.

Our crowning achievement was hosting the original Formula Atlantic series in 1975 and 1976. In 1975 some of us witnessed a young French Canadian named Gilles Villeneuve, earn his first Formula Atlantic victory, beating a field of up and coming international drivers in a monsoon.

Gimli Motorsport became world famous July 23, 1983 when we hosted an Air Canada flight which happened to run out of fuel over Red Lake Ontario, as a result of confusion over Metric conversion.

In 2018, we started the first phase of the track re-pavement/improvement program which will continue this year and will eventually see the track fully repaved.

The first Classic Motor Sport Vintage weekend came about as a result of misfortune for the Vintage Sports Car Racing Club (VSCR) of Minnesota. They had run as a support series for the Trans Am race run on a street course in Minneapolis. When they were informed by the Trans Am group that their participation was no longer required we started a conversation to provide them with their own race grouping at one of our events.



Classic Motor Works provided sponsorship. The first event saw a substantial field of vintage cars and the rest as they say is history! Come join us for a weekend of vintage racing, track laps and car show! 2018 Survey Results

GMP Asphalt Resurfacing Project

In 2018 the Winnipeg Sports Car Club (WSCC) initiated a project to begin resurfacing the asphalt at the Gimli Motorsports Park (GMP) road race track and so far have completed the repair and resurfacing of corners one and three (the dark asphalt marked below with arrows).

In 2019 the plan is to continue the project and at a minimum repair and resurface corners six, seven and eight, the main straight bump as well as make repairs to the area just south of the road race track that is used for autoslalom and race schools. Additional work will be done depending on the amount of funding that is raised.

When the road race track was originally built in 1973 thirty club members donated \$1,000 each (between \$5,000 and \$6,000 in today's dollars) to help construct the track. However, please donate any amount that you can and remember there is no obligation. You can also fund raise by organizing a social, holding a raffle, holding a garage sale, creating and selling a calendar of club cars, etc.

Last year the Community Places Program matched the amount of money the WSCC put into the project. This year we will apply to this same program again and **donations made before the end of May, 2019** that are in the club bank account may potentially be doubled by this program.

Watching Over The Fence...

I first went to the Gimli Motorsports Park as a twelve-year-old in 1976. Back then the spectator area was outside the track across from corner four. I remember watching over a fence and seeing Formula Vee and Formula Ford open-wheel race cars that looked similar to the Formula One cars I watched on TV at the time (this was the year of the famous Formula One battle between James Hunt and Niki Lauda that is the subject of the movie *Rush*).

Seeing race cars in person for the first time at Gimli left an impression on me that TV couldn't possibly convey. The cars were loud and you felt the sound as well as heard it. The senses were further assailed with the smells of burnt race fuel, hot oil, hot brakes and tire rubber. A couple of years later my oldest brother raced a Formula Ford with the club and I was then in the pits even closer to all the sights, sounds and smells of racing.

Three dozen years later, after watching too many *Top Gear* episodes, I decided it was time to stop watching and time to participate. I started by competing in time attack. Trying different lines around the track and making car improvements to decrease my lap times became an obsession. After a couple of years of time attack, for my 50th birthday, I purchased a race car and completed everything necessary to get my amateur road race license.

I can vividly remember my first road race. Fresh out of the race school I was strapped into my race car seat and covered in brand new Nomex socks, shoes, race suit, gloves, balaclava, helmet and HANS device. While gridding on the track I looked over at the racer next to me and they gave me a thumbs up that I returned. I felt welcomed and part of the group.

As a novice there were a thousand things running through my mind at the start of this first race: don't forget to shift, watch the tach, don't over-rev, look for my braking point in the first turn, don't get excited and forget to brake, don't hit anyone, if a car spins in front of me—don't look at it—look for a clear gap, should I stay on the outside? should I try and go on the inside? . . .

All that didn't matter as when the green flag dropped the pack of cars very quickly pulled away from me. I didn't see them again until about 5 laps later when they all passed me.

However, over the next few years, I was thrilled whenever I set a new personal best lap time and when I noticed that the front of my car had started to collect stone chips as I was now beginning to keep up and follow some of the other cars. Soon, for the first time in a race, I passed another car for position.

Also, the first time I didn't receive any blue flags and I finished a race on the same lap as the leaders felt like I had won a Grand Prix. I again had that same incredible feeling when for the first time during a race I lapped another car.

The existence of the Gimli Motorsports Park allowed these experiences to happen. If any of these resonate with you then please consider donating to the asphalt resurfacing project. Your donation will help preserve the track for future racers to enjoy. Right now, there may be another potential young racer watching over the fence.
